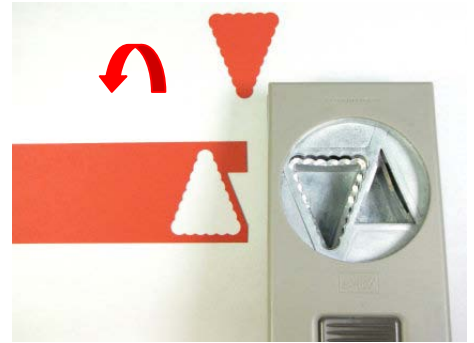
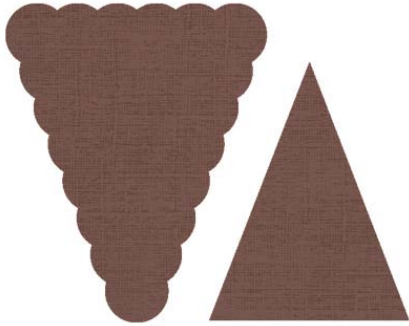


Petite Pennant Builder Punch Tutorial



1. The Petite Pennant Builder Punch design features two pennant shaped cut-outs within one punch.

The fun pennant shapes are designed to use individually or layered giving you even more bang for your buck!

Because they have more than one punch shape these punches are a bit different to use than standard single-image punches. Use the following information and tips to get the best results.



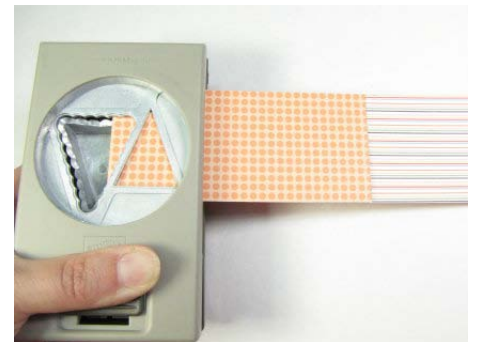
2. The Petite Pennant punch coordinates with the Pennant Party stamp set. It also makes a versatile standalone punch.

Traditional punches are designed so a single stamped image matches a single punch. The Petite Pennant Punch is designed to punch each stamped image separately.

The versatile triangle pennant shapes can create a variety of images like pennants, party hats, and Christmas tree images.



3. If you want to punch out only the larger scalloped pennant without a lot of waste you can. Hold the punch with the cutting window face up. Slide a piece of card stock that measures about 2" high and as long as you wish into the left edge of the punch and punch the large scalloped pennant. To punch the second scalloped pennant image flip the card stock over and insert it from the left again.



4. Continue flipping the card stock after each punch to get the most of the same image from your card stock strip.

5. To punch out only the smaller straight-edged pennant slide a 2" high card stock strip in from the right and repeat punching and flipping the card stock.

If punching stamped images with the scalloped pennant image be sure to stamp scalloped pennant images with the point at the bottom edge of the card stock. If punching stamped images with the smaller straight-edged pennant be sure to stamp the image with the point at the top edge of the card stock.

6. As with most punches that have very detailed or small punched areas, the Petite Pennant punch works great with card stock because it is nice and rigid. If punching thinner paper, like Designer Series Paper, stack 2-3 pieces or stack with scrap paper when punching to get a clean cut and avoid the very narrow tips of the pennant images being a bit crumpled or torn.

NOTE: When creating punch art create extra definition and the illusion of depth by sponging the edges of the punched pieces before assembling.
